

WHAT IS A WRITE OFF?

You've probably seen or heard that Schitt's Creek scene or audio floating around on social media this time of year, but what exactly is a write off?

"A write off is when you buy something for your business and the government pays you back for it."

Not exactly....

A write off is a business expense that reduces your taxable income (i.e. lowers your overall profit, not the amount of taxes you actually you).

Let's go over an example:

Revenue (sales) \$1,000 Less: Write offs (expenses) \$250 Taxable Income (profit) \$750 In the example above, instead of having to pay taxes on the \$1,000 you received in sales, you only need to pay taxes on the \$750 net profit. WHAT CAN I WRITE OFF? Below

you'll find over 75 different business expenses that you could potentially write off, but remember, every business is different and depending on the nature of your business, there might be exceptions.
